

## **Policy Update**

UpliftED Convening

September 15, 2020

## **General Appropriations Act**

- Budget totaled \$92.2 billion after the Governor's veto.
- The Governor vetoed funding for 145 education-related programs and projects that impact all education stakeholders.
  - Education vetoes State Board of Education (SBOE) and Board of Governors (BOG) – totaled more than \$340 million or approximately 34% of all vetoes.
  - The Florida College System (FCS) budget vetoes make up only 3.5% of the \$340 million in vetoes.



## **Notable Budget Vetoes**

#### **Complete Florida Plus - \$29.3 million**

Complete Florida Plus is a program that houses multiple resources used by state colleges and universities; most notably, the Complete Florida Degree initiative an online public library system, MyCareerShines, and distance learning services. Tomorrow, September 16th, the Board of Governors will discuss a legislative budget request to restore funding for essential elements of the program \$20.9 million.

#### **Universities of Distinction- \$15 million**

The Universities of Distinction program would divide funding between Florida's non-preeminent state universities to support their creation of unique, nationally-recognized, workforce-relevant programs.

#### **Workforce Diploma Program- \$1.5 million**

Program to assist adults aged 22 or older to complete their high school diploma and obtain career technical and soft skills.

## HB 171: Postsecondary Education for Certain Military Personnel

 The Articulation Coordinating Committee must convene a working group with appointees from the Florida Board of Governors (BOG), the State Board of Education (SBE), and the Florida Department of Veteran Affairs to translate military experience into college credit.

#### **HB 7067: K-12 Scholarship Programs**

 Adds dual enrollment and early college participation to options of accelerated course bonus funding



## CARES Act: Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund

#### Free SAT and ACT Testing (\$8 million allocation)

• Provides free SAT and ACT testing to high school students during the 2020-21 school year. An estimated 200,000 students will receive a \$40 voucher to cover the cost of their test.

#### **Rapid Credentials (\$35 million allocation)**

• FCS "rapid credentialing" programs that can be completed in 18 weeks or less. The goal is to increase institutional capacity for short-term, in-demand technical and industry certifications that articulate into college credit (otherwise known as a stackable credential).

#### Pathway to Job Market Dashboard (\$2.5 million allocation)

• Development of an online data dashboard the features data on all career and technical (CTE) programs and corresponding labor market data to provide a comprehensive picture of the labor market.

#### **New CTE Equipment (\$10.9 million allocation)**

Equipment grants to strengthen in-demand CTE programs for school districts.



## **Bright Futures Updates (EO 20-212)**

- Eligibility requirements for ACT and SAT test scores extended until December 1<sup>st</sup>, giving students who graduated during the 2019-2020 school year additional time to qualify for a Bright Futures scholarship
- For Summer 2020, students able to use their scholarship funds to cover distance learning fees.
